The Labrador retriever's coat repels water to some extent, thus, facilitating the extensive use of the dog in waterfowl hunting.

Labradors are a devoted breed that can be wonderful asset to a family. Their friendly and lovable temperament makes them good with children, visitors and other family pets. They can also be extremely flexible with different environments, as long as they receive sufficient exercise and attention.

Labradors have a strong build, plenty of energy, and high intelligence. They are natural hunters and are equipped with an exceptional sense of smell. These traits are what have made them ideal hunting dogs, police dogs, rescue dogs, and even seeingeye dogs.
